

A PATIENT STORY

"Time, money, and energy are short – we can parent our current child but I don't think we can handle another one," 30-year-old April told her Advocate.

She and her boyfriend had an eight-month-old daughter they were co-parenting. Although April had a good, steady job, caring for her child and working stressful situations drained her on a daily basis. She told her Advocate she was undecided as to the outcome of her pregnancy but leaning toward abortion, and her boyfriend supported that decision.

Her Advocate provided an informational pamphlet on abortion which outlined the development of a baby during the various trimesters as well as provided education on the types of abortion procedures, helping to answer many of our patient's questions. She refused to take any other informational pamphlets, such as Having a Healthy Pregnancy or Baby & Me Too. She wanted to learn how far along she was in order to help her make a decision of whether to abort or to carry.

Upon learning from the Nurse that her pregnancy test was positive, April was given an ultrasound. The image of a 16-week-old appeared on the screen, and our young patient appeared surprised. "It's quite developed," she said. Her unborn wiggled around as if in response. April began asking questions of the Nurse, concerned because in her job she uses an X-ray machine and she's been drinking alcohol.

"I'm worried about birth defects," she said. "I guess I'd better start taking better care of things."

The Nurse referred April to a physician but assured her that the baby's growth appeared normal and that her ultrasound images would be made available to a physician with her signed medical records request.

Afterwards, April returned the abortion brochure to her Advocate. "I won't be needing this anymore; I'm going to parent," she stated.

Ultrasound – it makes the difference!

We are now using our new, 3D ultrasound machine. Thanks to our local Knights of Columbus for raising the funds for this purchase!

WHY WE GIVE TO TRUE CARE

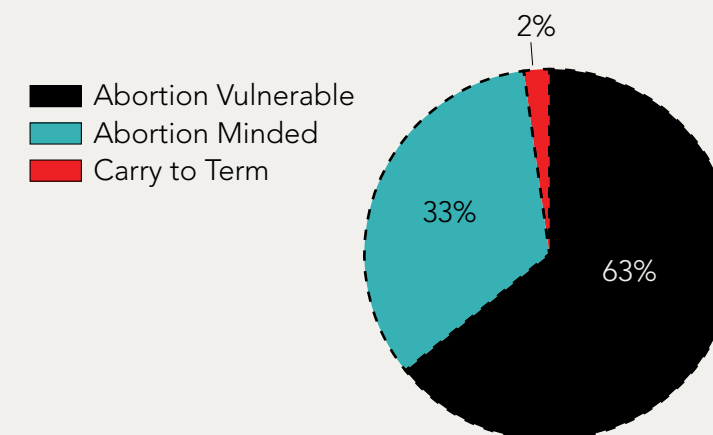

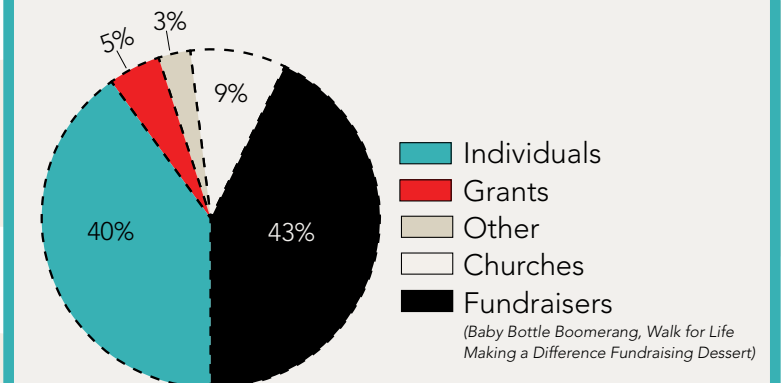
